


Mr. Blume was superintendent at Coleman Motor Co. Mr. Lanham was a pharmacist with Eson Drug Co. Mr. Rose worked at Rose Spratlin Trf. Co. In 1939, Art and Jean Drehle, J.H. and Minnie Britton, and Mrs. Laura E. Nicholas lived here. Mr. Drehle was a driver for Littleton-Englewood Bus and Mrs. Drehle was operator of Virginia Beauty Salon in Englewood. In 1953, Mrs. Cora Clark and A.R. Cox lived in this building. In 1955, residents were Burt Brown, Cora Clark, and David A. Kane. In 1959, R.S. Hillman, Cora Clark, and Cecil Byers lived here. Mr. Byers then owned the property. In 1961, this was the residence of Mrs. Dorothy Wilmoth, Q.H. Mckim, and Cora Clark.
