HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE):
This building was erected in 1954 by Ulva Clair Thomas. The 1953 city directory lists U.C. Thomas as having a real estate business here in an earlier building, the eastern corner part of the Culp Block, which had been erected in 1892. Portions of the Culp Building further west still remain. Houstoun Waring stated that "Mr. Thomas had participated in about every civic activity that went on in Littleton after moving here in 1918." Born in Iowa in 1880, he became a partner in his father's mercantile business when he was 13. When his mother contracted tuberculosis in 1897, the family traveled to Boulder in a covered wagon. Thomas returned to Colorado in 1918 and acquired a ranch southeast of Littleton and grew sugar beets and alfalfa. In 1919, he became manager of the Columbine Mercantile Co. and the first grain elevator in Littleton's history was erected under his supervision. In 1922, Thomas purchased the Littleton Hotel and in 1924-25 erected an earlier Thomas Block. Thomas was involved in real estate and insurance, was secretary of the Nevada Ditch Holding Co. for almost 30 years, and was on the board of the Centennial Turf Club. He was president of the Littleton Creamery Assoc., a founder of the Arapahoe County Fair, board member of the YMCA, and a leader of the Chamber of Commerce. In 1955, the new building was divided into two storefronts, both of which were listed as vacant. In 1959, this building housed Littleton Stationers and Printers, which continued tto ccupy the building through 1965.
