


ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Two-story rectangular brick commercial building with flat roof; projecting metal cornice with brackets; parapet above cornice with arched ornamentation and piers which project above roof. First story has single storefront with inset entrance with double glazed metal frame doors with transom. Flanking entrance are grouped plate glass display windows set at an angle from top to bottom and with thick metal frames. Projecting flat metal and fiberglass hoods above windows. Painted brick below windows. Windows of second story are bricked over. One-story rear projection clad with vertical metal siding. Long shed roof with metal pole supports above double metal frame glazed doors and band of three large plate windows. Parking on east and northeast. CONSTRUCTION HISTORY (DESCRIPTION, NAMES, DATES, ETC., RELATING TO MAJOR ALTERATIONS TO ORIGINAL STRUCTURE): Historical Background, Cont.--According to files of the Littleton Historical Museum, Harry Hiller Lilley (1867-1929) was the son of John G. Lilley, an English immigrant, who created Middlefield Farm, now the Columbine Country Club golf course. Harry Lilley married Kate Griffith, a widow with four children. Lilley, who operated a livery stable in this building, was an original member of the John G. Lilley Hook and Ladder Co.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE): This building was built as a livery stable between 1900 and 1908 by Harry H. Lilley. The southern portion of the building replaced part of an earlier frame livery stable at the site which first appeared on the 1900 Sanborn fire insurance map. The Lilley livery stable was listed at the location in the 1905 Littleton city directory. The 1908 Sanborn map shows a two-story masonry southern part, with the eastern part occupied by a harness shop and the western part a livery which included a one-story iron-clad extension on the rear. By 1914, the livery had been converted to a garage and the harness shop to a barber shop; the rear part housed the fire department garage and a dance hall was located on the second floor of the building. The building was then addressed as 232-50 W. Main St. The 1921 and 1932 Sanborn maps show a garage occupying the west and rear parts of the building with a barber shop in the east front part of the building. The 1932 city directory showed the building numbered as 218-24 W. Main St., with the G.W. Stine barber shop at number 218 and number 224 vacant; the Boddy Apartments were located on the second floor. The 1939 directory showed the same tenants with the addition of Joss Men's Wear and the Joss Funeral Parlor in the west part of the building; I.J. Joss was the proprietor of the establishments. In 1949, the undertaking establishment was still present along with two storefronts, while the extreme rear of the building was used as an electrical company warehouse. During the 1953-65 period, the building housed Majestic Furniture, the Boddy Apartments, and Crocker's Barber and Beauty Shop (1953-55) and Bailey's Barber and Beauty Shop (1959-63).

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE: This building is associated with the history of transportation related services in Littleton, having been constructed about 1907 as a livery stable by H.H. Lilley, and later housing an automobile garage, as well as other businesses. The building represents early twentieth century commercial construction in Littleton through its brick composition with flat roof and ornamental cornice.
