HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE):
This building (addressed as 133 S. Nevada St.) was constructed about 1926 as the exchange offices of the Mountain States
Telephone and Telegraph Company. The building is absent on the 1921 Sanborn but appears on the 1932 edition. Littleton
first received telephone service on 1 July 1902 when the Colorado Telephone Co. opened an exchange on the second floor of
the Abbott Block, 2430 W. Main St. C.L. Thompson, who also operated a drug store, was the first agent for the telephone
company. In 1933, Herbert E. Thompson was manager of the Littleton office. The phone company remained here through at
least 1953; by 1959, Columbia Savings & Loan occupied the building and was still present in 1961.
