


ARCHITECTURAL DESCRIPTION: Brick bank building with rectangular plan with beveled edge at southwest corner and clock tower at southeast corner. Building is two stories on south and west and one story on east. Three-story clock tower at southeast corner has clock faces on all four directions. Southwest beveled corner is uninterrupted brick with Banklone sign in center. Concrete foundation. Ribbons of inset windows along south and west walls of first story; thinner ribbons of windows on second story. Inset double door entrance on east, north of clocktower. Angled double door entrance on west elevation near north end. Beveled corner overhangs deep inset of first story which has large plate glass window. HISTORICAL BACKGROUND (DISCUSS IMPORTANT PERSONS AND EVENTS ASSOCIATED WITH THIS STRUCTURE): This building houses the oldest bank in Arapahoe County, the Littleton National Bank/Bankone. The Littleton National bank opened in 1909 as the Littleton State Bank in the Coors Building on Main St. W.C. Cryslar was first president of the bank which opened with assets of \$25,000. During its first two years of operation, the bank stayed in the Coors Building. In 1911, it opened its own building at the southeast corner of Main and Prince where it operates today. In 1921, the name of the bank changed to Littleton National Bank under the leadership of Preston B. Dunn. The bank closed for 11 days in 1933 and its customers suffered no losses when it reopened. This building was erected in 1972 directly south of the site of the 1911 building. In 1982, Littleton National Bank was purchased by Affiliated Bank Shares of Colorado, a holding company, which specializes in community banks.
