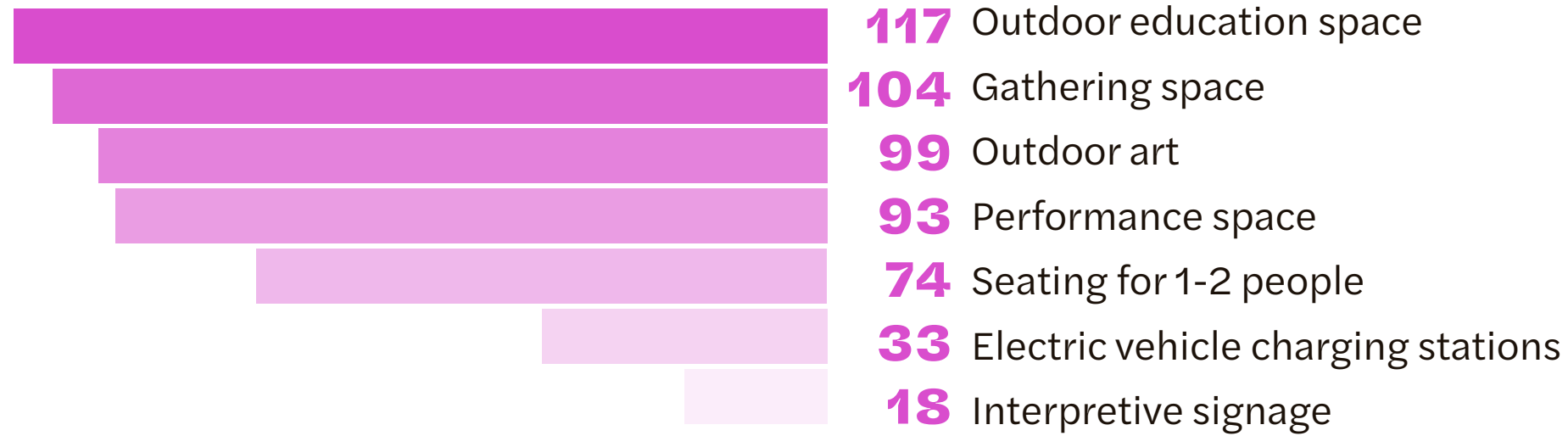

Parking can be problematic here, depending on day of week and times. Please do not cut into parking by converting spaces to electric vehicle charging stations.

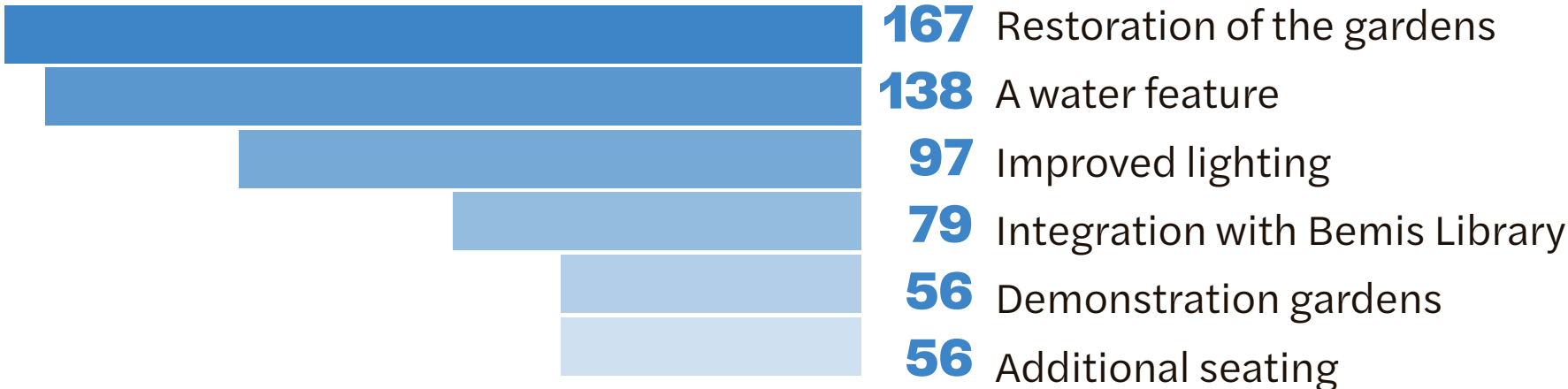

I would specifically like to see native plantings that will support our local ecosystem.

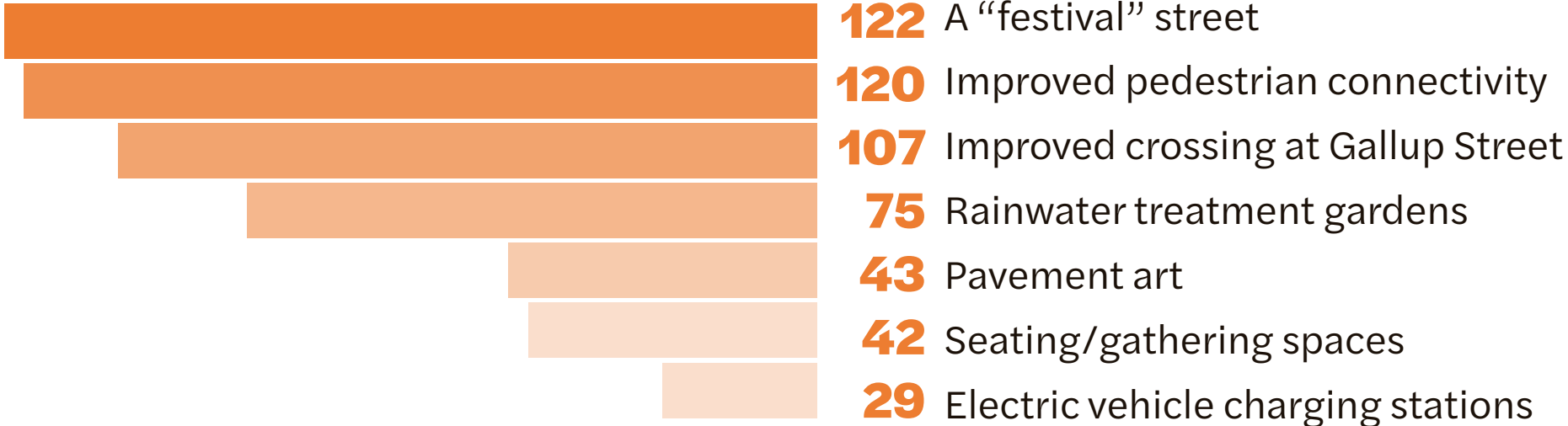

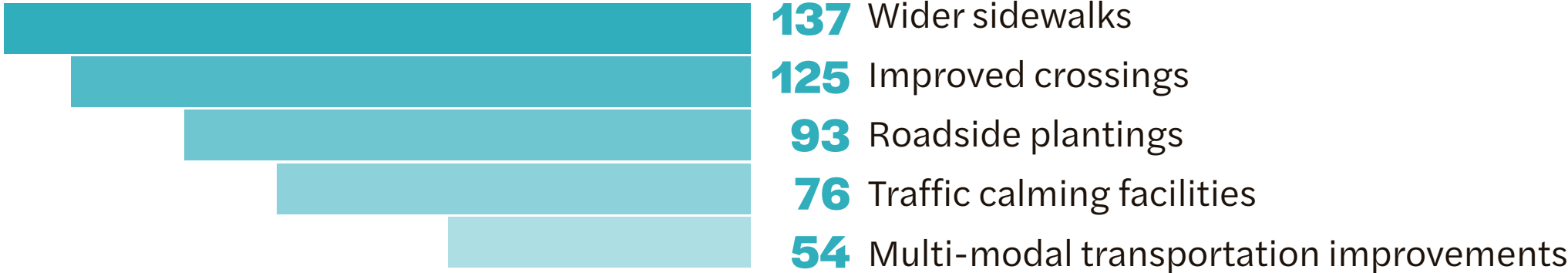

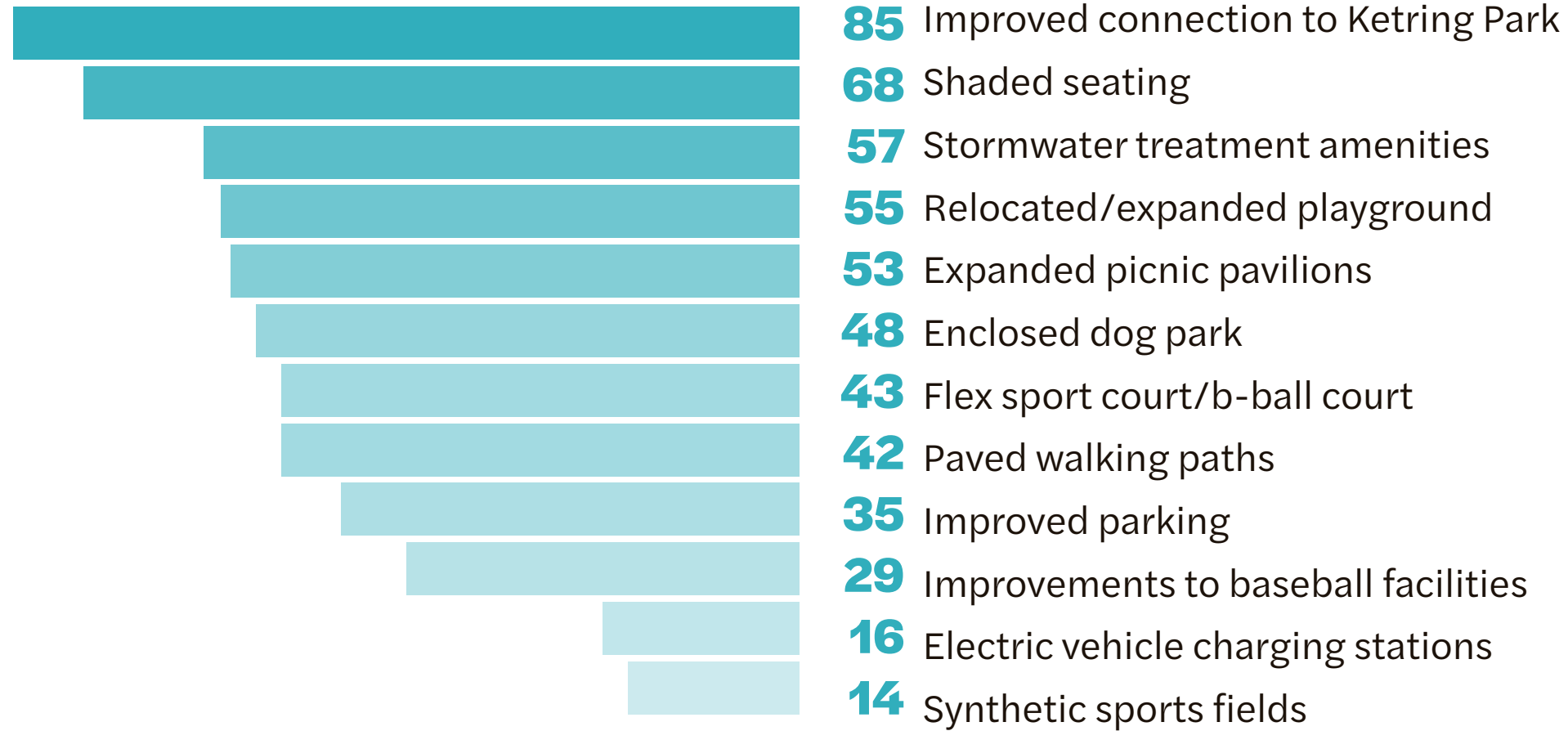

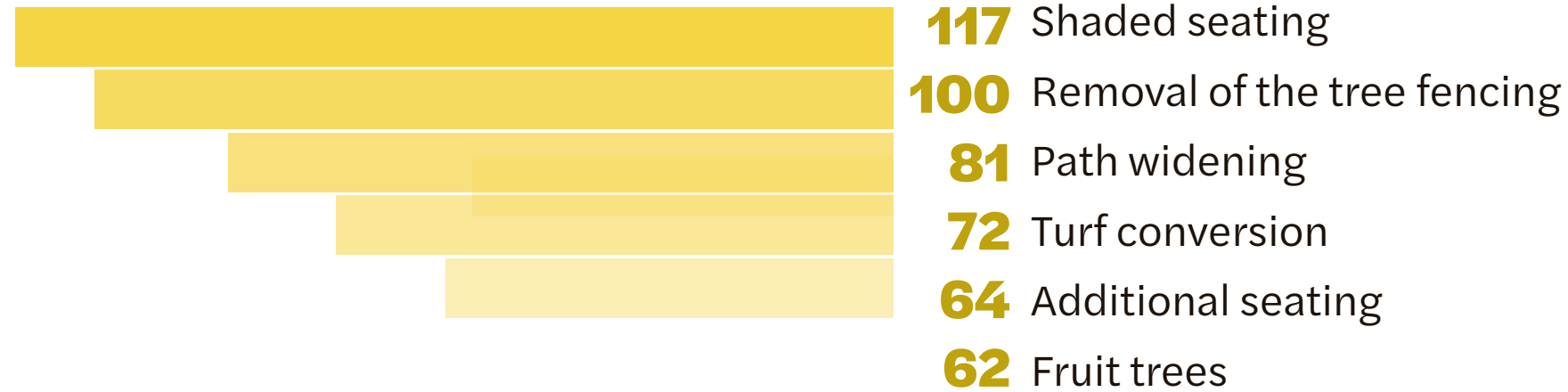

Would like to see more diversity instead of so much turf.

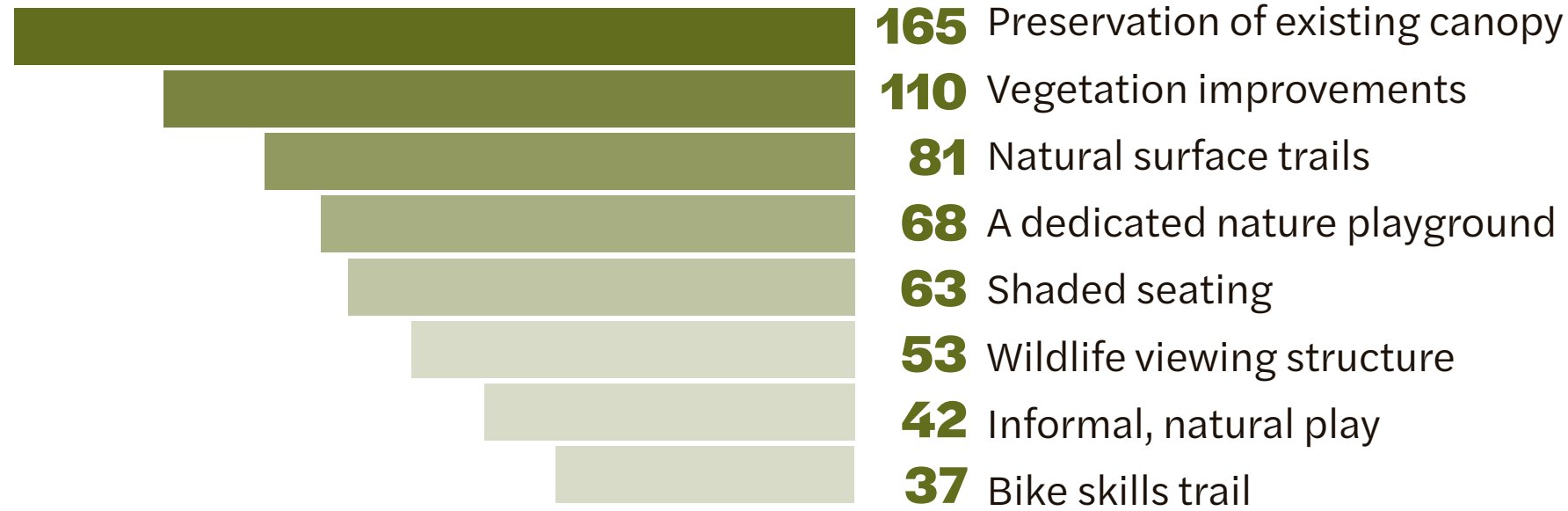

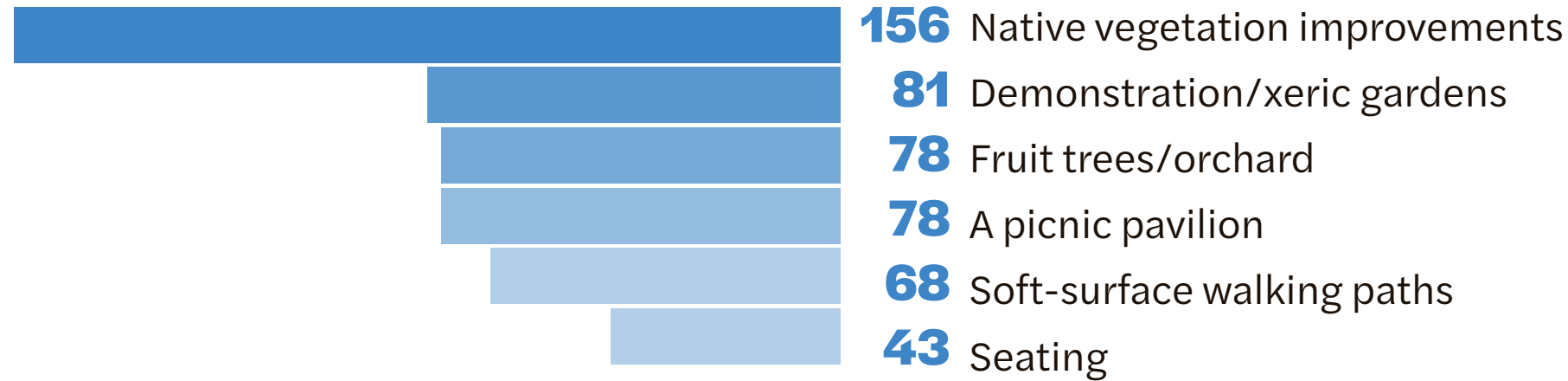
The water quality of the lake has been getting worse.

A shaded structure in this field would be perfect and adding local vegetation and examples of plants that do well in direct sun would be educational and create a more natural feeling environment.

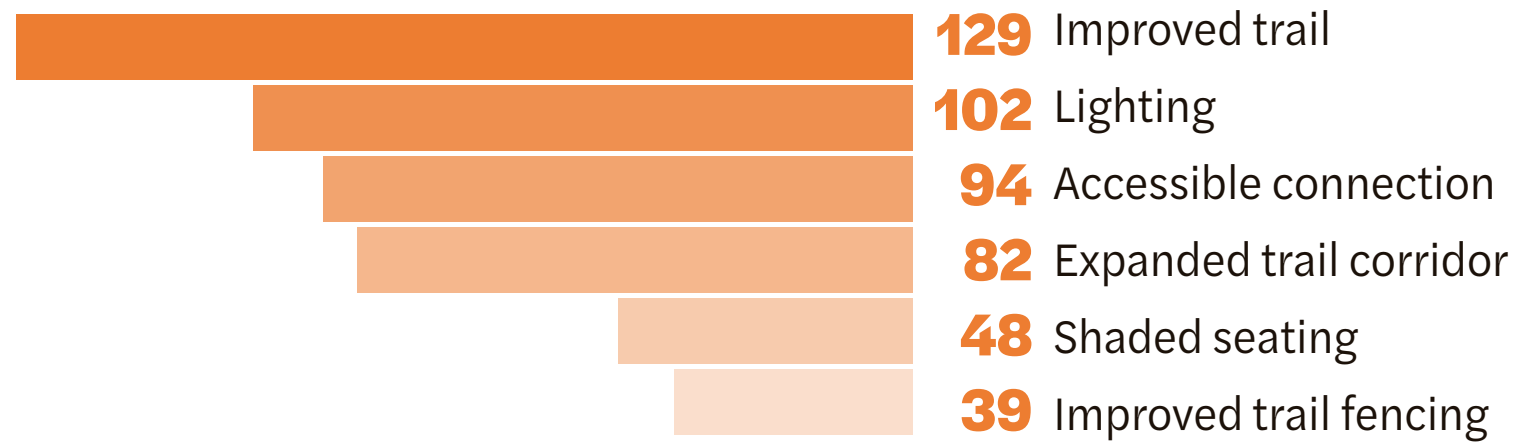
Best to keep this area quiet and make it a beautiful natural grasslands.

Definitely more shaded seating and rain/hail shelter is needed on this section.

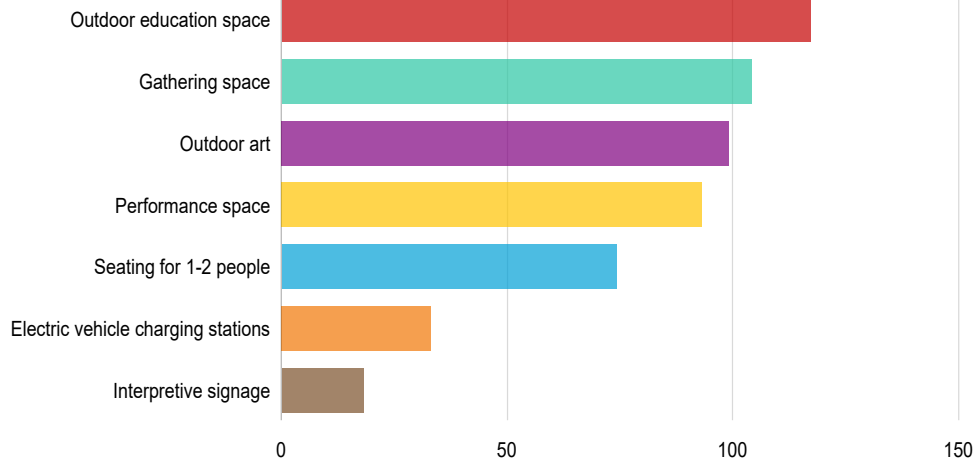
This part of the trail is very closed in by fences, expanding the view would be ideal. This is the only way for those of us who run/walk/bike to loop around the park so it's important.

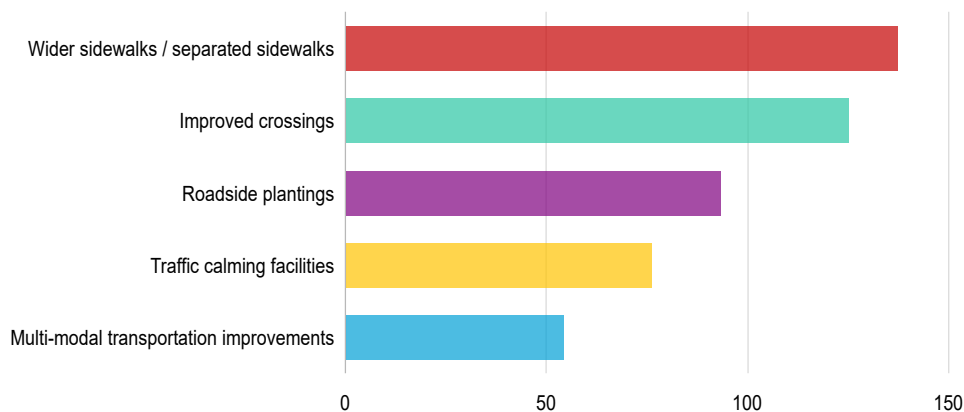

Wider sidewalks would be great. The current sidewalk is too narrow to walk comfortably with a stroller. When two people pass each other, someone has to step off into the grass to make room for the other person to pass.	1
This entire "Ketring Lake loop" is such a popular walk for hundreds of people on a daily basis! There needs to be a straighter, more passable sidewalk along the west side of the museum. There are drainage issues at the maintenance entry to the Museum from Gallup, where rain or melted snow puddles and forms very dangerous ice areas, directly in the walkway. The snow maintenance must also be improved along Gallup on the walkway ("sidewalk") --because the walking path is curved, the snowplow doesn't know where the path is and scrapes off into the uneven grass areas and creates a very difficult surface to walk safely on. We have to walk ON THE STREET to bypass the "plowed" path in the winter.	1
There is no sidewalk on the east side of the street between the Parkhill intersection and the path that runs along the edge of the farm.	1
The trees don't seem as healthy as they could be.	1
The sidewalk that connects the water side to the lawn side of the park needs help. It is narrow and you have to cross over the parking lot entrance to stay in the park rather than be on the street.	1

The pavement of Gallup street, Library lane and the museum parking lot should match in color and textures. It might be nice if there could be a unique color that unifies the area. The sidewalks need to be at least 6 feet wide so that several people can walk together and to make it easier to pass. More native planting to unify library lane and the museum parking lot. There should be pedestrian crosswalks at the library lane intersection, the Carmelite monastery intersection at the south and at Sheppard on the north. Slightly raised colored walks similar to the new crosswalks in the downtown area would be nice. Perhaps visually narrow the width of Gallup with wider sidewalks or bike lanes. These could be used for parking for big events, but would help slow down the traffic speed. The museum parking lot lights should turn off after midnight, or be reduced to one or two being lit.	1
The lights on the apartment buildings are pretty intense at night, so perhaps putting some sort of diffusing barrier that still lets some light through, because it does provide some security being able to see across the field, but not as blinding as it currently is.	1
The largest priority for me, before all of the above options, is basic maintenance and improved upkeep. For example, better weeding, trash picked up and cans emptied more often, etc.	1

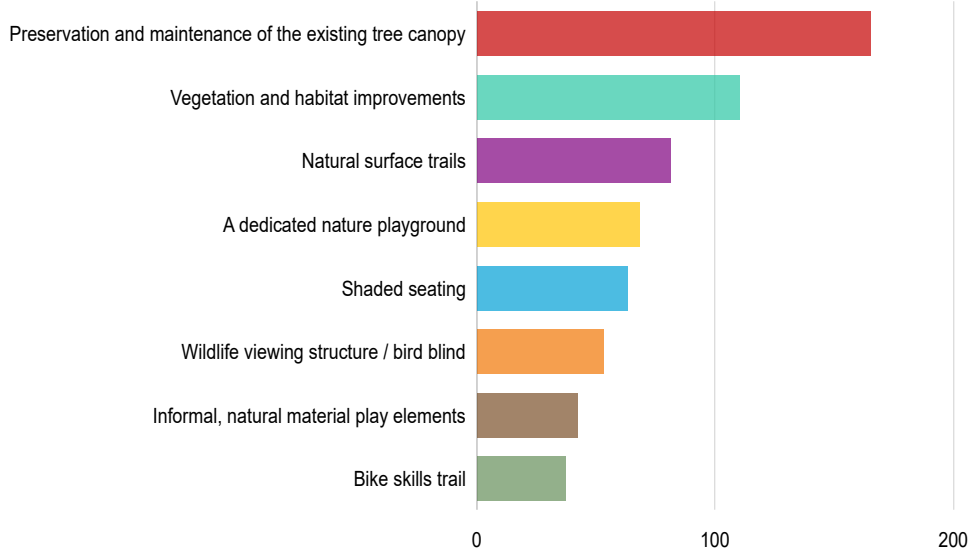

Nowadays we walk with our dog around the Lake and complete the full circle past the museum and the delightful farm animals. It feels like a nature walk, which it is, but there are a couple of areas to look at: First, the walk around the east side of the Lake has little to no shade. and trees would be so good there, And if there were bench seats with awnings that would not be too difficult to maintain and would blend in with the natural surroundings. Thank you again.	1
Specifically on the path leading from Lakeview St to Ketring Park on the north east side, needs to be mowed/ maintained more regularly. This is my primary path of entry to the park, which I walk with my dog almost every day. Have noticed a lot of foxtail grass and cheatgrass growing in this area, which the seeds are harmful for dogs and other animals because they burrow into the skin and are difficult to remove. Ive seen poison hemlock growing on the south side of this section along the trails that lead up to the lake. On the south side of this section there is a circle of logs in the trees that could use some cleaning up, as there are often homeless and teenagers who leave messes in this area, which is out of sight from the walking paths. Sometimes trash from homeless on the north side of this section as well, so maybe maintaining the small dirt trails in this section a bit better. 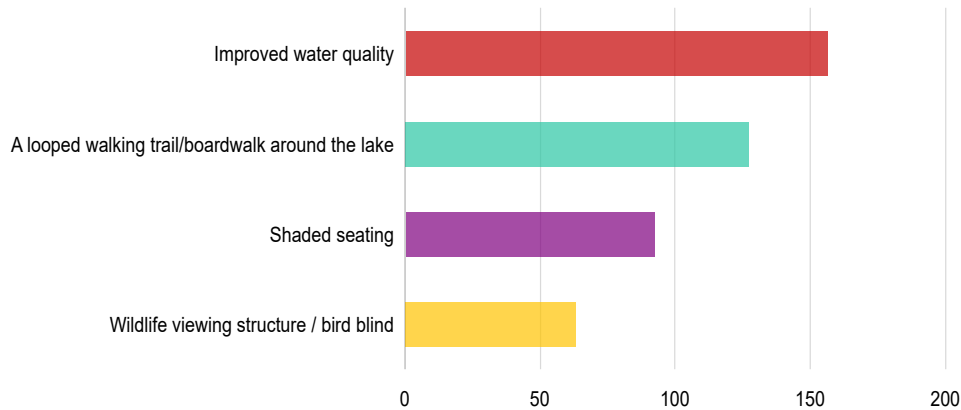

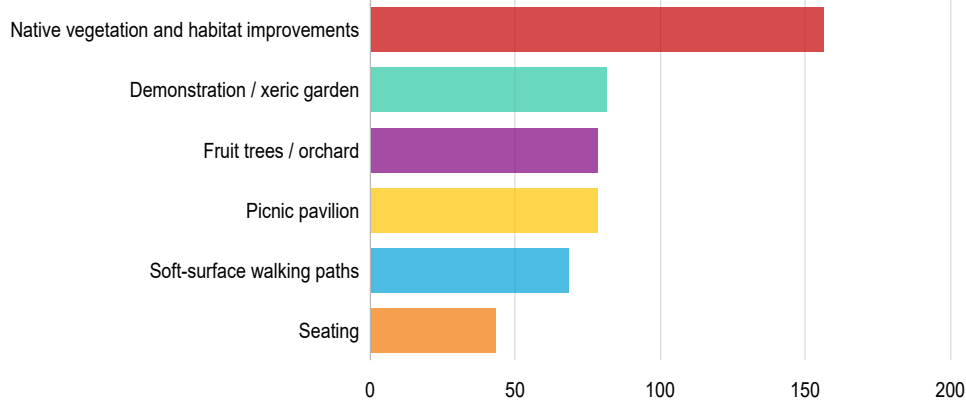

As a fisheries biologist, I know the lake is seriously disturbed. The primary problem is excessive nitrogen and phosphorus (called eutrophication) mainly from too many waterfowl, (duck and goose droppings). This leads to excessive growth of algae, which depletes oxygen when it decays. The lack of oxygen limits the amount of fish and other aquatic organisms that can live in the lake. The lake was renovated in 2004 and I was part of that effort. After the renovation the lake was in good shape with lots of fish. Over time, the ducks and geese have done their damage. In 2004, the north edge of the lake was turned into a filter to clean up nitrogen and phosphorus, like a filter on an aquarium. However, this seems to not be working anymore. So, my two suggestions are to use the filter as it was intended and try to limit the number of ducks and geese (I know, the citizens like them!). Feel free to contact me-Don Conklin.	1
