Lots of families walk a loop around the lake and then walk their kids to Gallup playground. The crossing needs to be formalized on both sides of the street.




This part of the trail is very closed in by fences, expanding the view would be ideal. This is the only way for those of us who run/walk/bike to loop around the park so it's important.







o be a straighter, more passable sidewalk along the west side of the museum. There are drainage issues at the maintenance entry to the Museum from Gallup, where rain or melted snow puddles and forms very dang erous ice areas, directly in the walkway. The snow maintenance must also be improved along Gallup on the walkway ("sidewalk) --because the walking path is curved, the snowplow doesn't know where the path is an d scrapes off into the uneven grass areas and creates a very difficult surface to walk safely on. We have to walk ON THE STREET to bypass the "plowed" path in the winter.

There is no sidewalk on the east side of the street between the Parkhill intersection and the path that runs al 1 ong the edge of the farm.


The trees don't seem as healthy as they could be.



This area and particularly the area with the reeds is my favorite. Please do not change the area with the ree ds!!! It's so private and truly a sanctuary for us locals. I love the privacy and that this area is so wild and abu ndant with flora, fauna, birds, butterflies, etc in the spring and summer. I come here every day and to draw more attention to this area or to disturb it in any way would truly be heartbreaking! Please leave this area al one!

The water quality of the lake has been getting worse. This area needs to be patrolled better. I have seen ma ny more people turning their dogs loose in this area, so the dogs can get in the water and chase the wildlife. Building a trail/boardwalk around the lake will upset the wildlife even more. Too many people are dumping bi rd seed back by the back parking lot to feed the birds. That is not good or natural for the birds. The money s pent on a boardwalk would be "better spent" on hiring more park rangers to protect the park!!! There is getti ng to be more trash left all along the shoreline around the lake, as people are climbing down to sit and hang out along the shoreline where the water has receded. More focus needs to be brought to attention about ke eping all areas of the park safe for patrons and wildlife. All of the possible improvements will bring more peo ple to the park. Having enough rangers to be able to patrol and keep all areas of the park safe...needs to be a priority.

The walking path around the lake is good, if it Doesn't mess with the coyotes. The coyotes live back in that area between the lake and the farm.

The restoration of the lake needs to be improved. It's disgraceful in its current state. The lake as a whole ha s not been maintained properly. The canal used to feed the lake with spring runoff but that has ceased. The canal should be cleared of overgrowth so it can be used for this purpose. We had record levels of rainfall in 2023, but nothing is in place to utilize natural rainfall to improve water quality of the lake. The well doesn't s upply enough water on its own. The willow tress that have sprouted up and are growing quite tall on the eas t side of the lake need to be cut down. They are blocking the view that has been enjoyed for decades by wal kers and home owners. The seating/fishing area next to the parking lot should be landscaped and maintaine d. In its current state it feels neglected: improve landscaping; prune trees. The sidewalk around the lake wa s cracked and damaged by the semi trucks during the installation of the well. Damaged concrete should be r eplaced.

The last reshaping of this lake killed my favorite willow tree and greatly upset a number of other trees that w ere once directly next to the lake's edge. I do appreciate all the cattails that now grow there, but every time some huge plan is made it destroys another piece of this place where I and many others spent our childhoo ds.	1
