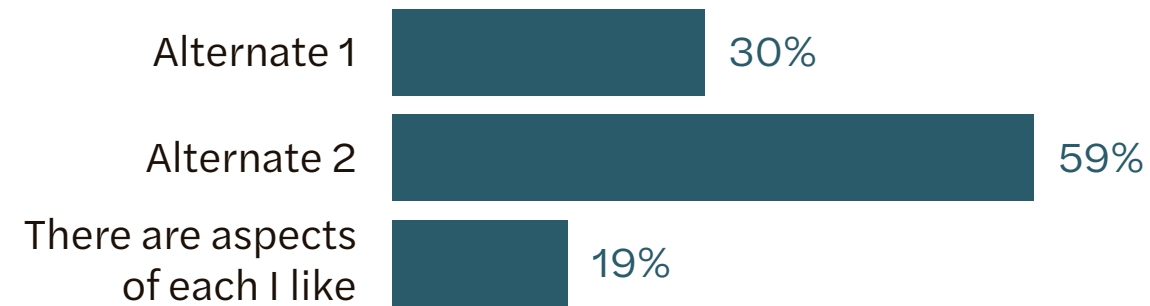

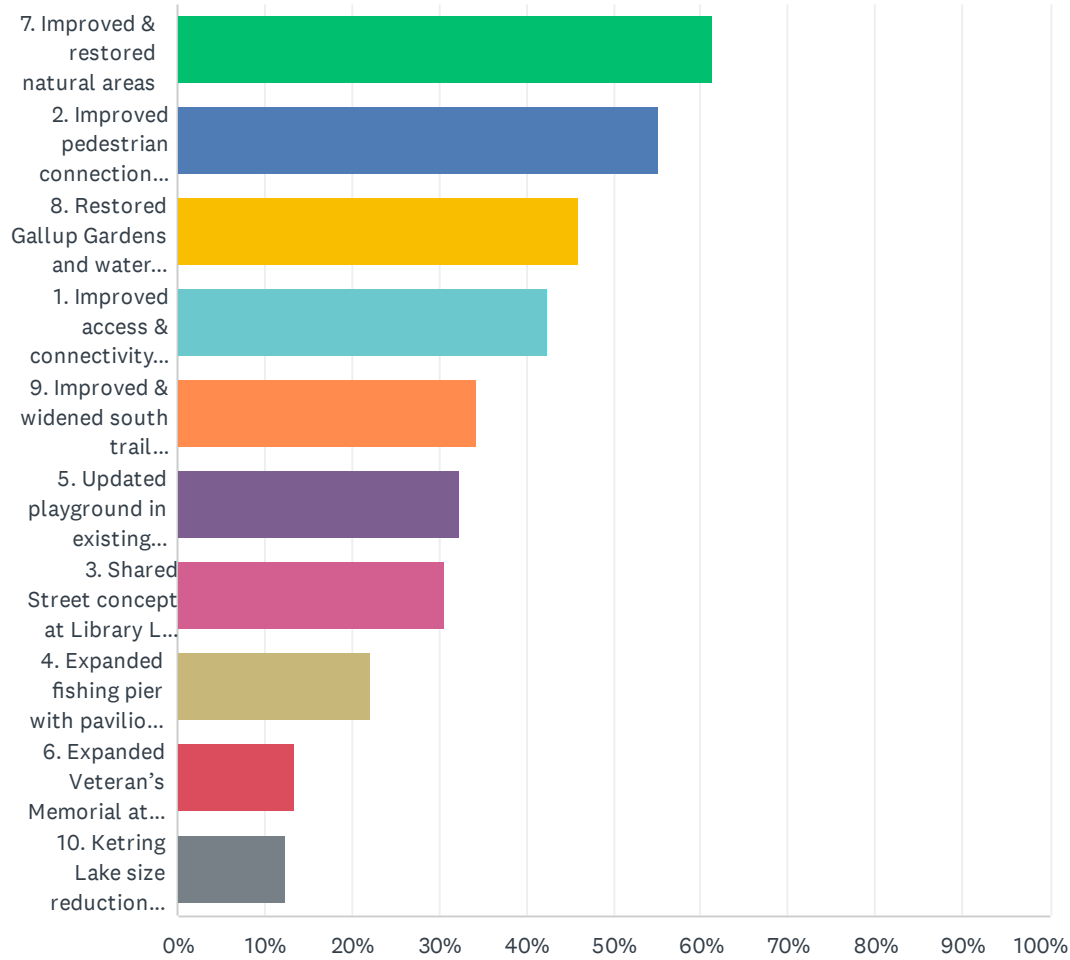

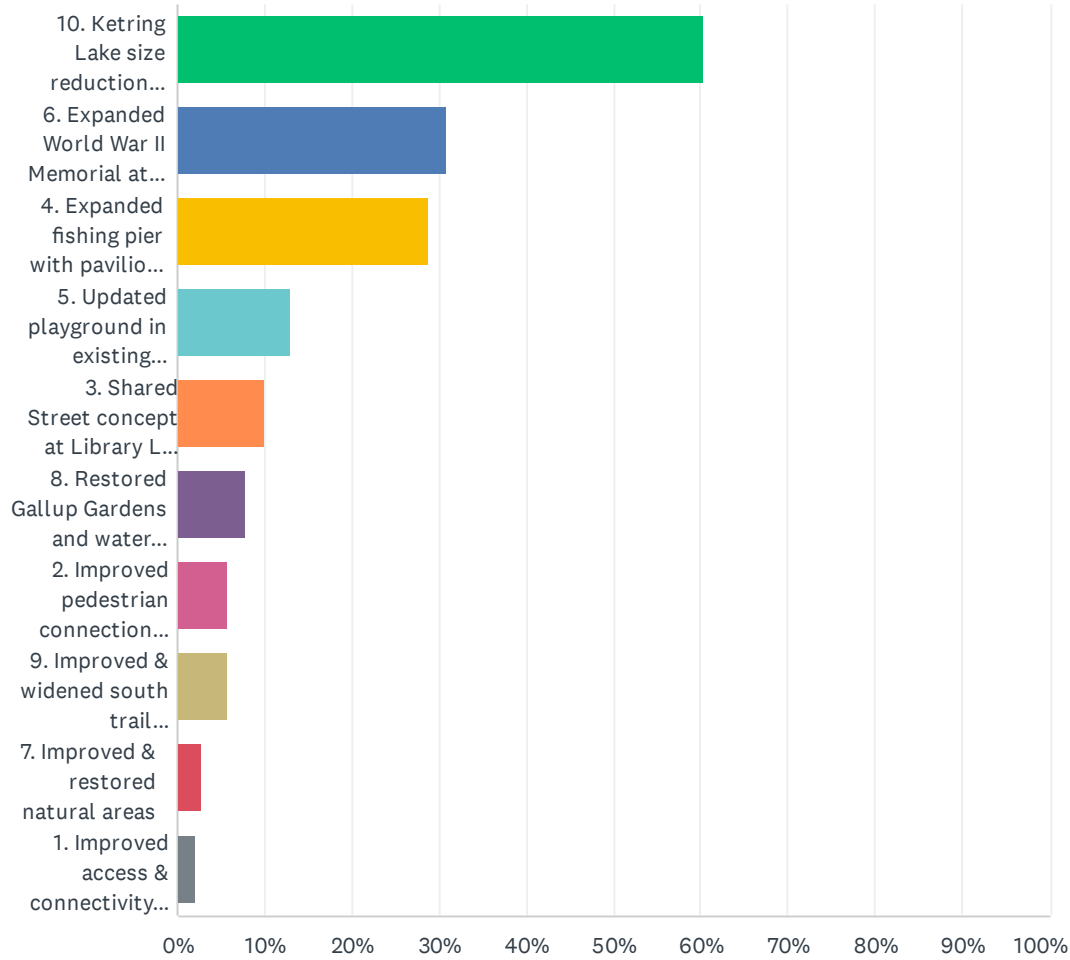

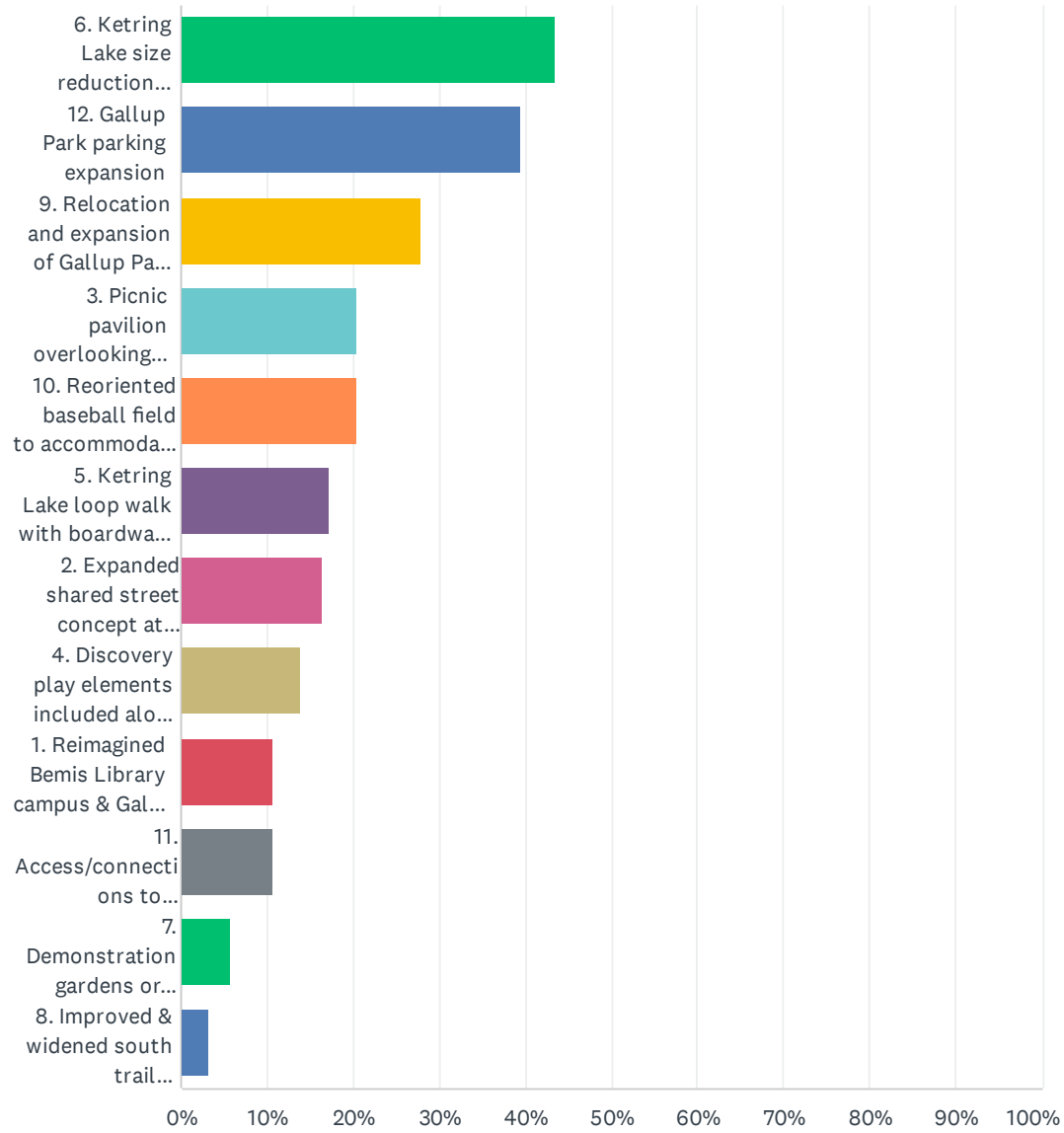

Additional parking lots add unnecessary Maintenance cost, increase drainage and heating issues, and would result in removal of the trees that are getting close to maturity. Closing the library lane to Gallup will reduce the Gallup traffic in this area making it safer for the pedestrian/children access to the museum and Ketrings park. Just keep in mind that Gallup is a connector street and is the library access from the east and south. Having a strong connection to the museum parking lot will minimize this. Formal pavilions reduce the ability to passively use the park. I like the movable picnic table concept better. Keep the wetlands the same size draining into the reduced size lake. There may be opportunities to create little streams from the wetlands to the lake, which may increase some habitat. The boardwalk will add tremendous cost with less than the desirable anticipated use. 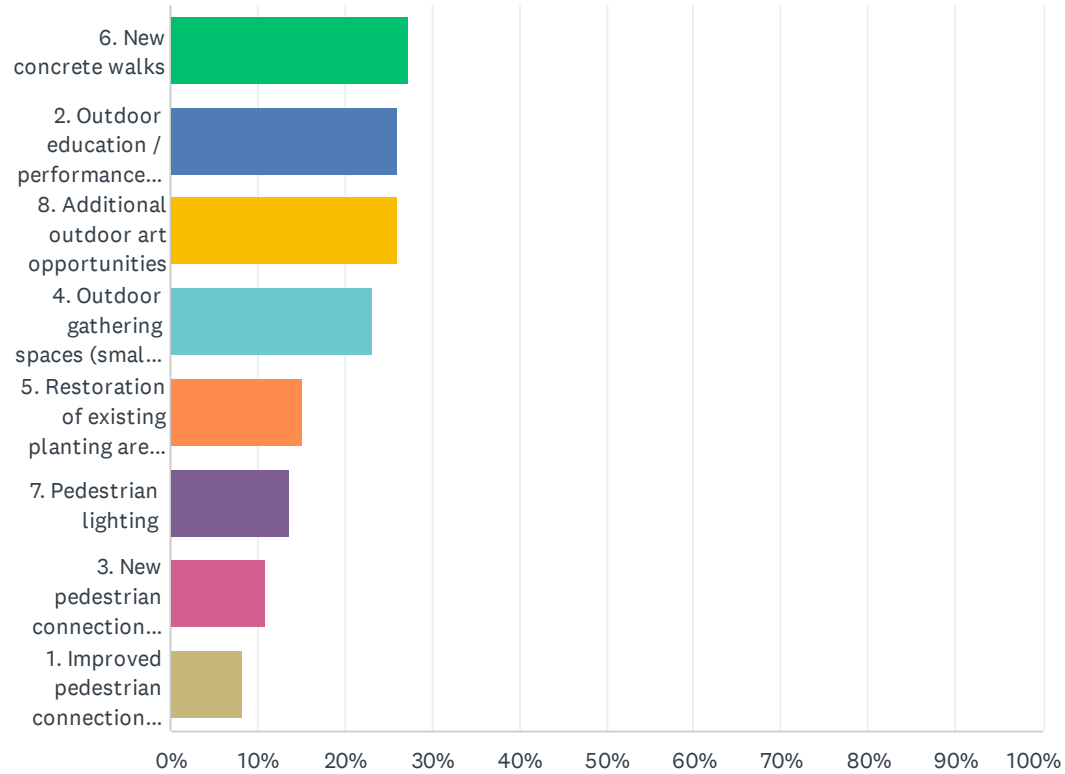

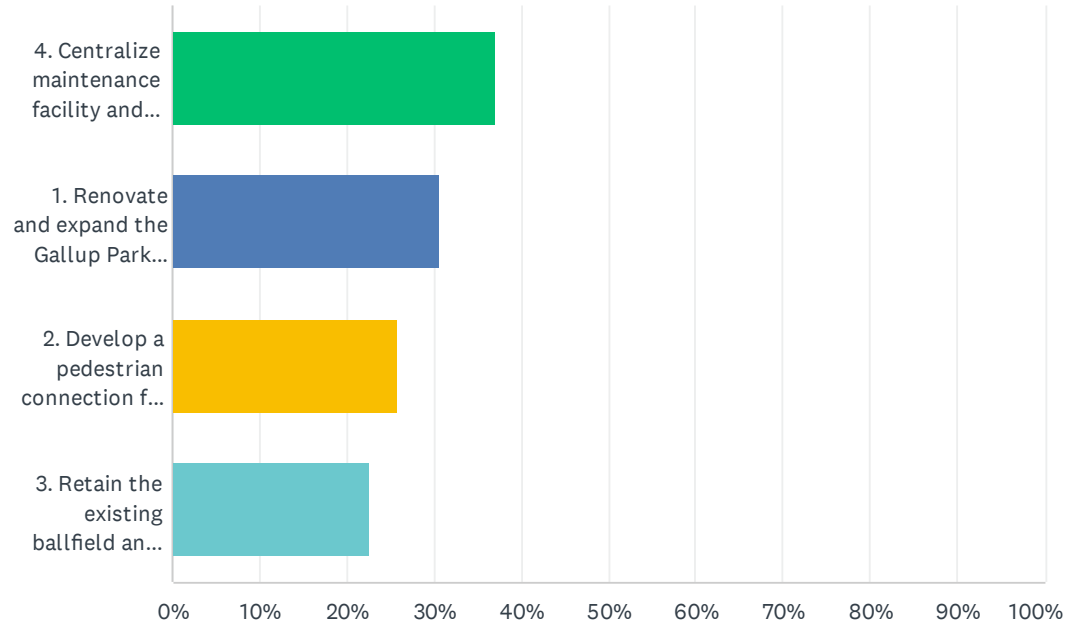

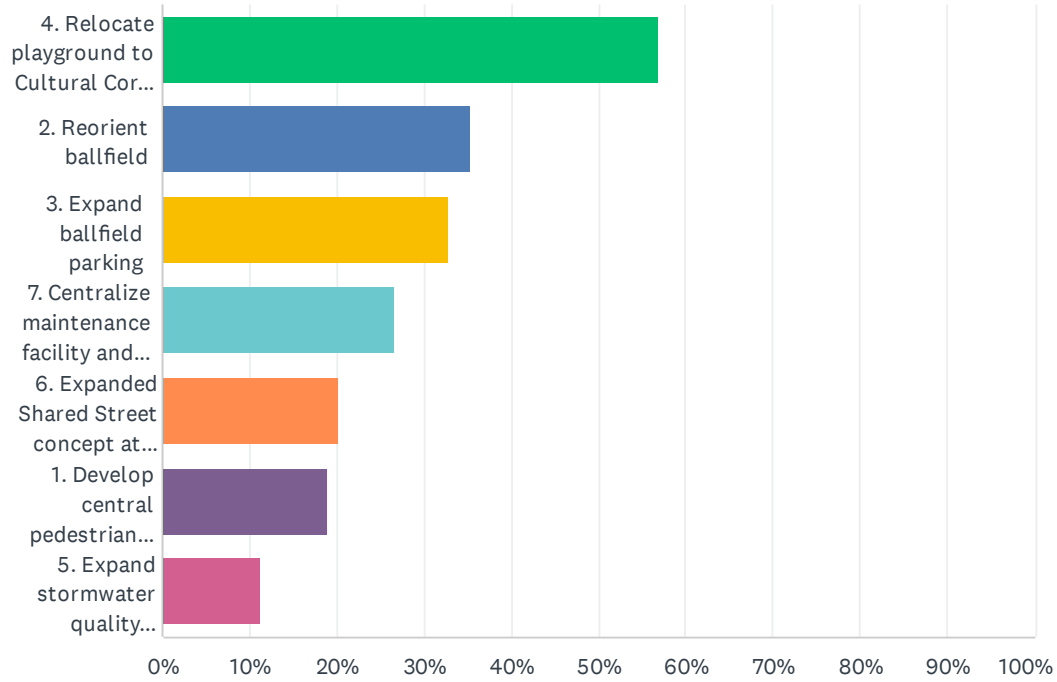

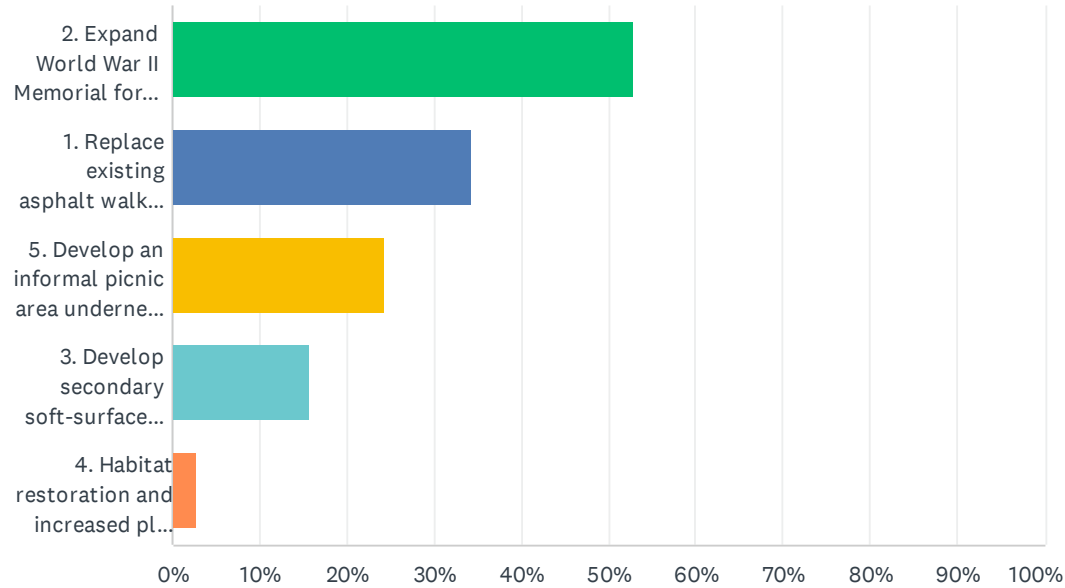

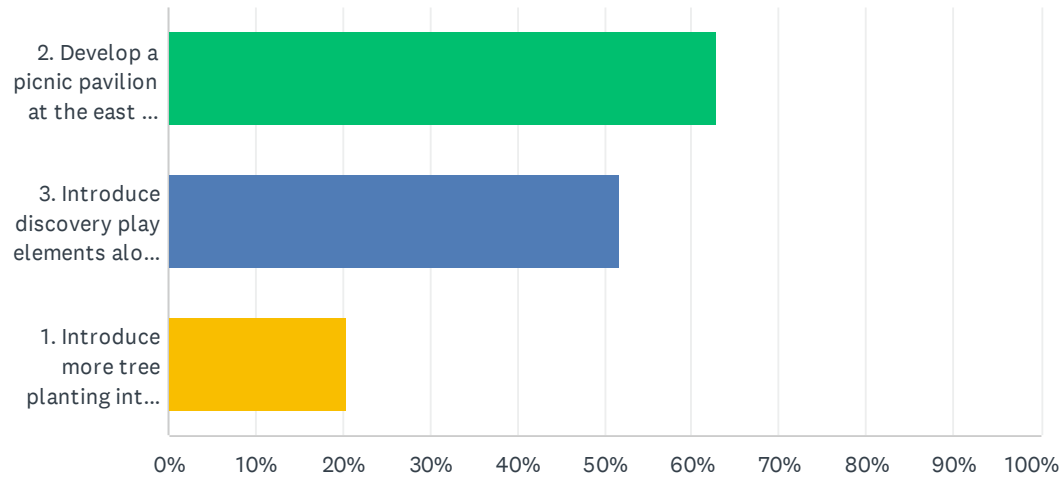

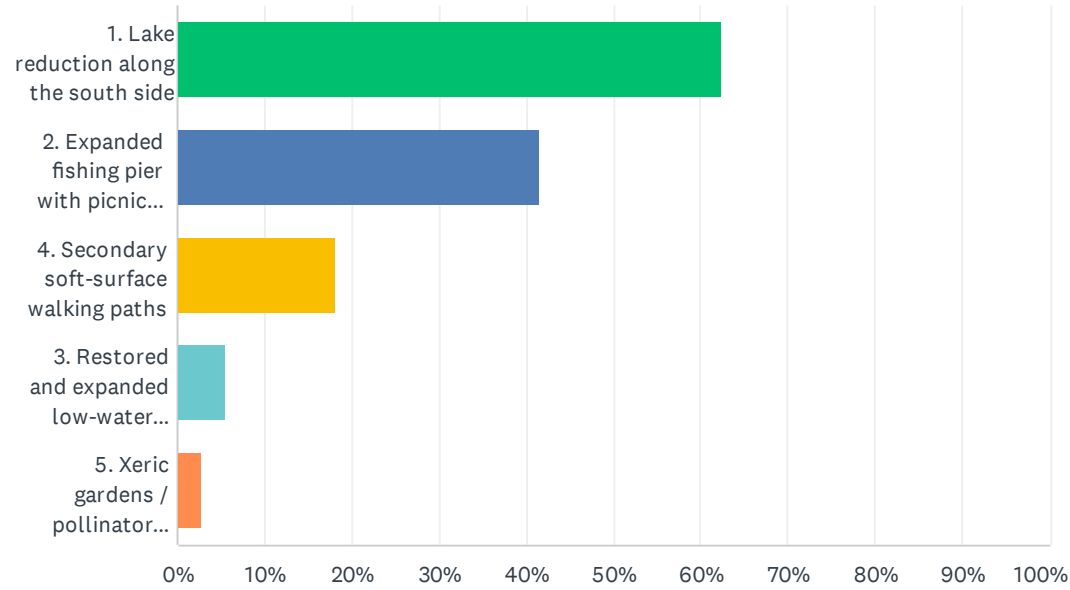

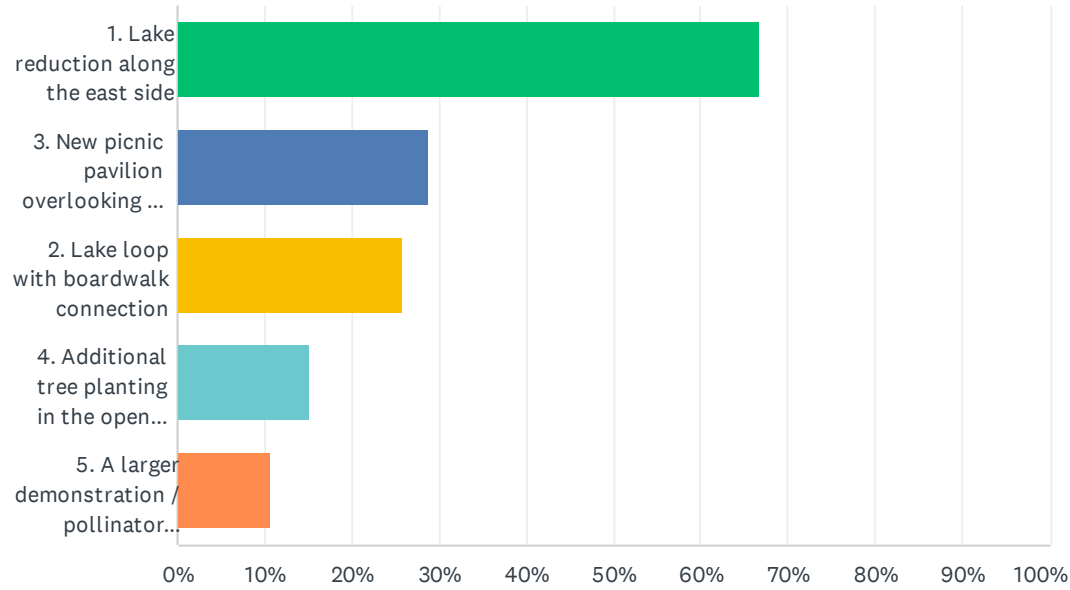
